Hawthorn Leaf Spot



What are the reddish brown spots on my hawthorn leaves?

This is a fungus (*Entomosporium mespili*) that primarily attacks English Hawthorns. The fungus is most active in the spring. The leaves are especially susceptible during prolonged periods of cool and wet weather.

Will my tree die if the fungus is not treated?

Very seldom will the tree die; however, it may lose most of its foliage in the late spring or early summer if not properly treated. Repeated annual defoliation can reduce growth and weaken trees.

Is there anything that can be done to make my tree(s) healthier?

Yes. We recommend four things:

- 1. Rake: Since the fungus overwinters on dead leaves and young twigs please be sure to rake them up in the fall.
- 2. Prune: Annual pruning will allow air movement within the canopy, as well as remove undesirable sucker shoots.
- 3. Fertilize: Fertilization will help strengthen the overall health of the plant.
- 4. Treat: It is recommend that a fungicide be applied at ¼ leaf stage, and then again at mid-bloom.
